CG outlined current work on the analysis of the economic and environmental impact of coach tourism, which will be used to inform an integrated transport and signage strategy arising out of the LIFE project. Discussion around Burren Signage Plan which is still awaiting MF confirmation to proceed from Fáilte Ireland, and is also now connected with the Wild Atlantic Way signage project. MF to raise the question at next meeting of WAW development group and revert to CG. Discussion around whether appropriate environmental assessments had been carried out with some concern expressed regarding the naming and development of WAW Discovery Points possibly without appropriate assessment having been completed. MF not involved enough in that project to comment but did highlight that Paddy Mathews, WAW Project Manager in Fáilte Ireland, had engaged with local authorities since the outset of the project and that it must be the case that local authorities had raised potential issues through this process. MB to follow this up with Paddy Mathews Black Head Pull-in Areas. NPWS advised CCC to bring the application to An Bord Pleanala. Committee agreed the need to take this as a case study under GeoparkLIFE with a view to creating guidelines and procedures that would inform future projects. NPWS have had some internal conversations on process. Heritage Council would also advise on process. EM suggested that we should begin again with the application and take into consideration the 'in-combination affects' of the development. Were particularly impressed with the integration of the ETIS framework within the programme. **Time Sheets** All participants reminded about the time sheets: "no time sheets, no money". First ones received were not correctly completed and so the revised ones (using Greg Davidson's guidelines from the last meeting) are required as soon as possible. 	The position of Communications Officer for Geopark Life will be advertised shortly, initially on a one year contract with the option to extend. The position of Sustainable Tourism Co-ordinator remains under discussion with Fáilte Ireland and it is expected that this will be concluded in a few weeks. Siobain O'Brien's current contract under Transtourism is being carried forward for 6 months under LIFE to assess the administrative requirements of the LIFE programme.	
4.0	GeoparkLIFE	
	CG provided an outline of the progress made in the various actions, arising from research and individual meetings with partners, which were conducted last week. The results of the discussions have been collated as outline work programmes, and are summarised in handouts (attached). The B1 programme has been approved at earlier steering committee meetings and is progressing well under the co-ordination of TO'D, with input from CCC and FI. TO'D has prepared an update on Action B1 (attached).	
	B2 and B3 programmes are outlines at this stage (attached), as they now require input from local stakeholders such as BEN, Burrenbeo, Burren Outdoor Education Centre, XPO, etc. They will also require partner support for some movement of budgets from one action to another, which is allowed within a certain limit. BC will advise on this.	
	CG clarified that the work programmes must be tightly scheduled to allow time for, not only development and delivery, but also monitoring and evaluation. CG proposes to have the completed work programme for B2 and B3 for the next meeting.	
	CG also advised that Dr. Doug Comber, one of the keynote speakers at the recent GeoparkLIFE Sustainable Tourism Conference, will be available to participate in a webinar discussion on the subject of the care and management of tangible and intangible heritage. His experience is a valuable asset to the programme.	
5.0	Action B1 Tourism Enterprises Update Report Circulated (attached) Discussion:	
	 Sustainability Training Programme: JT outlined some of the challenges related to the Sustainability Training that has commenced: diversity of group, challenges in getting businesses to 	

measure, different ways in which businesses pay for and use resources, transferability of templates and information that is fed into them, desirability of site visits but lack of resources to complete same. JT also highlighted the benefit of cross-learning. TO'D emphasised the active research element of the programme development and delivery this time round and JT highlighted the need to note changes and ways of refining the approach and templates. MB noted that the County Council already have developed templates for some licensed premises and that these may be of use for some enterprises in the group.

- JT expressed concern about ensuring the credibility of the businesses being supported through the programme. KW informed the group that the Network now has a mechanism for removing businesses from the Network for 'qualitative' reasons e.g. poor sustainability standards.
- Interpreting the Geopark Module. Discussion around involving partners in the development of a ½ day module on Interpreting the Geopark. Previous meetings had highlighted the desirability of harnessing the expertise of the partners for this project. CG highlighted the Burren CD already developed as well as the knowledge of the Geopark team and felt this was sufficient for the level this workshop was aimed at. Group agreed that this programme should be developed by Geopark team and that the more indepth programme planned as part of Action B3 should involve the wider partner group. KC highlighted that OPW may have input on this as they train seasonal staff each year. MB suggested a simple laminate business-card type tool with a list of websites and places for further information.
- European Tourism Indicator System: TOD: highlighted indicators that will be used to measure Socio Economic Indicators: resident satisfaction, equality & accessibility, cultural heritage, local identity and assets. The details of this system will be presented at the next Partners Meeting.

6.0 Geopark LIFE Action B2 Habitats & Monuments

- CG distributed a Proposed Work Programme (attached). The purpose of this Action is to develop and evaluate best practice visitor management techniques at a range of sites throughout the Burren.
- In response to queries around partners input into the work programmes, CG clarified that expertise and time are the desired inputs.
- CMcG highlighted the importance of addressing Sustainable Transport
- A discussion ensued relating to Policies and Procedures which all

7.0	 project prior to money/time being spent. It was suggest that the Blackhead Pull-In areas project might be a useful project re-evaluate. It was generally agreed to start again, develop a plan and test against the matrix. BK highlighted that the AA requirement of the Habitats Directive related only to Natura 2000 sites – scope for the matrix to 'fill the gap' that exists for other non designated sites. MB to link with CMcG, BK & EM to progress the matrix and its application. Geopark LIFE Action B3 Conservation Management CG circulated proposed work programme for Action B3 – attached. The purpose of Action B3 is to involve/engage all relevant stakeholders in adopting long term conservation ethos and activity. Dr. Parr's recommendations are summarised as follows: • Ensure you have very efficient, accountable administrative and financial systems in place from the start • If there are partners involved ensure that they capture their contribution from the start & throughout • Use your Monitor - a good monitor is a great asset • Make sure you write up anything you can as you go along – people may leave!
