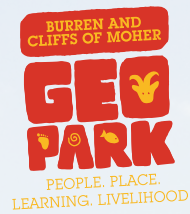
## Maintaining our International Treasure

## Play Your Part

Assist us to create a truly sustainable destination by following this code:

1. Plan Ahead and Prepare to reduce the risk of causing impacts or getting into difficulty.
2. Be Considerate of Others for example, park sensibly to avoid causing obstruction.
3. Respect Farm Animals and Wildlife, landowners and their property.
4. Travel and Camp on Durable Ground and always ask permission for access on private land.
5. Leave What You Find especially the limestone pavement\*, natural habitats and wildflowers. Take care not to damage monuments, walls and buildings.
6. Dispose of Waste Properly bring all rubbish home - even your biodegradable waste - "Pack it in, pack it out".
7. Minimise the Effect of Fire If cooking food, use a stove as campfires can damage the ground and can cause wildfires.

\*Limestone Pavement is listed as a 'Priority Habitat' in the European Habitats Directive, 1992, and is protected by law.
